Letter to Congregants from Rabbi Silverman

Dear Friends, January and February invite us into a quieter season—shorter days, cooler mornings, and a pace that encourages reflection. In Jewish tradition, winter is not empty time; it is gestation time. Beneath the cooler ground, life is preparing to emerge. So too in our own lives. Many of you carry decades of wisdom, memories, and resilience. You have lived through moments of great joy and real loss, and you know that renewal does not always announce itself loudly. Sometimes it comes gently—through a phone call to an old friend, a warm bowl of matza ball soup shared with family, or a familiar melody in synagogue that reminds us who we are and where we belong. Also, thank you to Rabbi Silverman, for his ongoing monthly Judaism classes, weekly Torah study Zoom classes, and his updates concerning Israel news and other matters.

Barry Wright: for scheduling and coordinating police for security for our services and other events; and for other ongoing functions, including work / arranging repairs as needed on our IT (webcam, microphones, etc.) equipment, helping with setup for services, obtaining a rack for our forms kept in the sanctuary; and other matters to keep the synagogue in good function.

Francine Rizzotto: (We are sharing the following explanation prepared by Francine at Freeda's request; as Francine's dedication is remarkable). After the high holidays this year, Francine noticed that the Rimmonim were very dirty. She brought them home and over the next couple of weeks she took great care and polished them. Then she realized that, as we only use them once a month, they needed to be protected from the air which helps to tarnish the silver; so, she then purchased silver-impregnated bags made especially for silver pieces. (CBS reimbursed her). So, each set of Rimmonim now have a bag in which to be stored between services. At the beginning of each Saturday service, when Francine knows the Torah's will be used, she removes one set and put them on the stand inside the Ark so that they are ready to be put on top of the Torah scrolls. After the service, before she leaves, Francine then wipes them down with a special cloth and puts them back in their protective bags. (Francine said: "When I saw how dirty they were, I thought of my mother, who was sitting on my shoulder, and said Francine, those need to be cleaned!"). Francine's goal is to have them stay nice and shiny throughout the year, and, hopefully, she won't have to do the big cleaning again.
