Rabbi's Message

We Need Our Congregation Beth Sholom Social Life!

Each year, the musical Kabbalat Shabbat service at CBS is a joy for Zoriy and for me. Preparing and playing it feeds our souls, as human beings, as worshippers and as musicians. We hope you feel the same when you attend, whether in person or by the magic of Zoom.

And the celebratory nature of the Oneg Shabbat, afterward, has traditionally been a central part of that fulfillment, by spending time in a carefree, social atmosphere with our members and friends, our congregation family.

The isolation of recent years has dampened the social element of our festivities, particularly for me, as I had been caring for an immune- compromised family member and could not participate fully or extensively in pre- or post-service conversation.

Now that our services are returning to "normal" -- or what will ultimately become a new normal for all of us -- whatever this evolving social life may be, one thing I know is that all of us have a need for this personal interaction, this caring connection, in additional independent contexts as well as with services.

The importance of our breaking bread together is of such great importance that the sages, after the destruction of the Second Temple in Jerusalem, when rabbinic synagogue life became *their* new normal, declared that it would not be the service in the sanctuary that truly would replace the previous Temple sacrifices and services. Rather, the social sharing of nourishment together would be the genuine focus of our Divine worship!

In this spirit, our member, Ben Solotoroff, has spearheaded a wonderful and popular Social Club for the congregation. During the healing process for which we are keeping him in our prayers, Ben will need the support of our fellow members and friends to insure that the efforts he began will be assisted, continued and expanded.

I hope that this year's Kabbalat will be the impetus for a joyful flow of sponsorships from all of our congregation family for an Oneg Shabbat or Kiddush, as well as our contribution to and participation in many social events that will mark a new era of warmth, comfort and family togetherness for Congregation Beth Sholom, our members, our friends, and our visitors.
