# Rabbi's Message

As we approach an early High Holiday season for 5782 – all of the holidays will occur this year in September and October – the world is looking to Israel for leadership in areas of Jewish, interfaith, and universal interest. Recognized as the global leader in the implementation of anti-Covid technology, Israel has recently re-instituted some of its previously curtailed protective practices. As new cases of Covid, as well as an alarming "eruption" of other serious respiratory viruses, have been spreading among fully vaccinated Israelis, the Health Ministry hopes that preventive measures, such as a renewal of its mask mandate, voluntary isolation and travel restrictions, will prevent Israel's having to return to more severe quarantines and lockdowns.

At the same time, harbingers of hope are peeking through the Israeli landscape. Though, in recent years, Orthodox Jewish governing bodies in the United States have attempted to put a full stop on the hiring of women congregational rabbis, by threatening to expel noncompliant congregations from their organizations, Israel's first woman leader of an Orthodox synagogue, Rabbanit Shira Marili Mirvis, has become her congregation's official rabbi. Her congregants call her *rabbanit* or *rebbetzin*, re-purposing terms traditionally used for the wife of a rabbi. Her husband good-naturedly calls himself the "*rebbetzman*," and women members sign up to deliver *divrei Torah* (sermons) and to chant the *Haftarah*.

Over the same period that Rabbanit Mirvis has developed her congregational leadership, the Middle East has been moving toward an unprecedented expression of interfaith unity. In 2019, plans were unveiled for the Abrahamic Family House, a symbol of the equal dignity of all religions expected to open in Abu Dhabi, the capital of the UAE, in 2022. The large, welcoming campus, designed by Sir David Adjaye, the Ghanain-British architect of the magnificent National Museum of African-American History and Culture on the National Mall in Washington, D.C., includes Abu Dhabi's first Jewish place of worship, the Moses ben Maimon Synagogue, along with the St. Francis Church and the Imam el Tayeb Mosque.

The recent Abrahamic Accord among the three major religious traditions, also originating in the UAE and possibly growing out of the good will generated by anticipation of the Abrahamic Family House, points to the importance of the leadership role our own Congregation Beth Sholom community can play in fostering communication and understanding with Christian and Muslim elements of our own community. May we, too, embrace every opportunity to create interfaith harmony.

For those observing the fasts of 17 Tammuz (sunrise to sunset, Sunday, June 27, 2021) and Tisha B'Av (the 9<sup>th</sup> of Av, a full day fast from sunset to sunset on July 17-18, 2021), wishing you an easy fast, with love and blessings to all – Rabbi Karen Allen. 386-254-2773

### Support the Leesburg Food Bank

I hope everyone is doing well at this point. Things have definitely changed in the last few months. During the pandemic there have been quite a few changes at the food bank. It has been amazing how the community has come together to help with their constant contributions of food.

Everyone has stepped it up. Normally the only significant contributions come in from November through January and steadily decline as the snow birds head back north. The donations at the very beginning were incredible and since then they continue to be strong almost every month. Now things are getting back to normal. We are giving out more than we are taking in. Because of the big commitment by the community it's only the last few months that the normal pattern is back. That is not bad because the room where we used to have the clothes and furniture now has food. It does appear that in the next few months that room will again have furniture and clothes.

Only the volunteers for the food bank are allowed in the food bank since the start of the virus. Someone takes the food that is packaged for each family outside to the family in a grocery cart. The supply of food from the grocery stores is also back to normal.

The food bank is open from 8 AM to noon, Monday, Wednesday and Thursday. Cookie and I work on Thursday with congregation member, Francine Rizzotto. Francine also works Monday and Wednesday.

Some other changes are happening. The Food Bank is picking up large items again and they will take clothing and various household items. At this time since no one is allowed in the building there is a trailer that we put things in and the people take whatever they want. Call if you need a pick up at 352-326-5463. Donations of all sorts are always appreciated.

The Food Bank has gotten some significant monetary donations from our congregants. To make a monetary donation, mail your check to Congregation Beth Sholom, with a note that it is for the food bank. We will pass the contribution on to them on your behalf.

The normal cans of pork and beans and cans of fruit are always needed. If you are planning on donating food or clothing at the food bank come to the north side of the building. The building is only a few blocks from the synagogue. The address is 503 N 13 St.


