When I created and introduced the Rabbi's Roundtable in 2011 as an outreach in The Villages, it gave me the privilege of bringing Congregation Beth Sholom to many in the rapidly growing Jewish community there who have found in us the congregational family that would become their spiritual home.

Our first meeting place was the private room at Perkins on Griffin Road, followed by Panera in Lake Sumter Landing, wonderful places to gather for friendship, conversation, a cup of coffee, snack or meal. Though we convened at the beautiful Pinellas Park Library for several years, as they were able better to maintain a consistent schedule for us, we are now meeting online via the highly participatory platform of Zoom, where we can return to our original custom of being able to break bread together, now virtually, while we speak.

These monthly gatherings continue as our opportunity for meaningful communication at a depth and breadth we can only touch upon in the more structured setting of services and social events.

Our subjects for discussion from the outset have been ambitious – Is there a G-d? What is the world to come? Do we have free will? – and they have introduced many of us to the informal and interactive conversation about "spiritual physics" that has carried over into our services, where members, friends and guests ask as well as answer questions, and express their feelings and opinions about topics brought to light through exploring the Jewish calendar, scripture and current events.

Many who are new to our congregation, or to the Rabbi's Roundtable, may not yet have had the opportunity to share in the wealth of our fellow members' and friends' experiences and insights.

Whether you are joining us for the first time or have attended for years, we invite you to suggest topics of importance to your life and your world today, I am hoping that your thoughts will bring to the Roundtable once again some of the foundational ideas that have shaped our spiritual conversations, along with fresh, new subjects that originate with you alone -- ideas we can consider together.

Bring your questions, your dreams, your presence and even your afternoon snack, as we embark upon a new time -3 p.m., on one Thursday each month -- for our special time of exploration together, with love and blessings for good health, good inspiration and good conversation – Rabbi Karen Allen -386.254.2773.

At that service we also had about 15 Beacon College students and their teacher, Dr. AJ Marsden. They had been invited by Dr. Marnell LaRoe Hayes who had been a guest lecturer at the College for their Cross Cultural Psychology class. They were involved and enthusiastic participants in the service as well as brought the average age of the attendees down about 40 years!
