Rabbi's Message

If I am not for myself, who is for me? If I am only for myself, what am I? And if not now, when? --Rabbi Hillel, Pirkei Avot (Ethics of the Fathers) 1:14

What is the price of isolation and inaction – and who pays it?

Many of us are navigating an extended journey of emerging from a personal, years-long period of isolation as a means of defending our physical bodies from danger.

Today, as we prepare for Purim and Passover, festivals celebrating justice and liberation, we are facing a more universal and less healthy isolation: a global pandemic of withdrawal from taking action against attacks, as lethal as any virus, that threaten millions of lives along with the equilibrium, peace and freedom of our entire world.

When Jewish students can be terrorized on campus -- when the atrocities against men and women in Israel signal a new attempt at annihilation of the Jewish people -- the world sees, and knows what this means: that any despot can act without consequence.

The foundational teaching of Judaism that we are responsible for our "neighbor," a term that includes love and respect for all people everywhere, mandates that we recognize and oppose the impunity with which literal murder is being practiced worldwide.

The virtual extinction of Ukraine, the destruction of its beautiful infrastructure, the resettlement of millions of its innocent people as refugees – or as hostages in Russia -- with little hope of return to their homes, should sound an unremitting alarm in our hearts. This is the fate many wish for Israel! The voices of hatred are growing louder.

While we consider what our response should be to the exponential increase of attacks against Jews everywhere, the tyrants of the world are taking the world's inaction as the perfect opportunity to extinguish the lives of anyone who opposes their evil intentions.

The murder on February 16, 2024 of Alexei Navalny, long the most feared opponent of the homicidal dictator Putin, is a tragic result of Putin's awareness that there would be no consequences to him of completing his gradual poisoning over years of Mr. Navalny.

Now, as the United States Congress is prevented by a small minority from approving the support for Ukraine and Israel desired strongly not only by America's legislature but by its citizens, we stand, mostly as bystanders, wondering if our beloved country's failure to act is emboldening still further not only Russia, to a long-threatened invasion of Poland and other NATO countries, potentially pulling the U.S. and entire free world into immediate war, but also China, to an impatiently awaited incursion against Taiwan.

Mr. Navalny's widow, Yulia, who had stayed out of public discourse, has now vowed to continue his work against brutal totalitarianism in Russia. What will we do to defend her life? To prevent the total collapse of Ukraine and subsequent reversion of the former Soviet Socialist Republics to Russian control? To insure the survival of Israel and the protection of the Jewish people throughout the world? To see each moment as miracle?

These are not political questions, but moral ones. As we ponder the contemporary application of Hillel's timeless paradox, I wish our extended Congregation Beth Sholom family a Purim of peace preserved and restored, and a sweet, healthy and compassionate Pesach, with love and blessings – Rabbi Karen Allen – 386.254.2773
