Rabbi's Message

Zichronah L'Vracha -- "May her memory be for a blessing" - A Life Worth Remembering

Having spent much of each week, during the last several years, with my mother in her South Florida home, as what both of us called her "health coach," I am grateful, following her recent illness and relatively sudden passing, to my dear friends, the leaders and members of Congregation Beth Sholom, who have given me the priceless time and privacy in which to manage the major changes this has entailed.

When I realized that I'd have to take my first flight in three years, to her funeral up north, with no time to stop at home for warm clothes, I remembered my mother's saying that "the best place to shop is in the closet."

This time, the closet would be not mine but her own and, even though we often joked that the only clothing we could share was a handkerchief, she did have some warm things that I could wear. When it came to shoes, that option seemed impossible -- we had never worn the same sizes – but something inspired me try on a favorite pair of my mother's, which to my amazement was not only suitable but comfortable.

There I was, standing literally in my mother's shoes. Suddenly, I had a visceral understanding of what that term really means, to stand in someone's shoes, figuratively as well as in the physical sense.

My mother often expressed her gratitude for the warm welcome and friendship she experienced upon meeting our members during her visits to our congregation's events, and through her participation in our charitable programs. Her spiritual legacy, as she expressed the wish to me, was that all of us, in our congregation community, would continue to work closely together. I am proud of the way in which we have done exactly that, through the collective efforts of our spiritual family. For your kindness and expressions of caring, and for giving of yourselves so that I might attend to my mother's needs, I thank you not only for myself, but also on behalf of my mother.

The experience of working so closely with her over this special time together has secured within me an unshakable understanding of the meaning of unconditional love. My mom loved each and every one of us, of you, without reservation - a gift of unconditional love that we all need.

What will we choose for posterity as the legacy for our time of leadership, which we are defining now? The leaders we become will shape the generations to follow us, as our parents' and grandparents' generations have inspired and challenged us. We must decide who we will be, those of us standing in the shadow – and in the shoes – of our ancestors.

Jewish spiritual tradition teaches that G-d created us for the principal purpose of receiving love and happiness. May every one of us choose to receive that priceless gift of happiness from G-d by giving that same blessing of unconditional love, and respect, to each other – with thanks, love and blessings – Rabbi Karen Allen – 386.254.2773.
