Rabbi's Message

See the good in the bad, for then the bad turns to good – The Baal Shem Tov

With the High Holidays just barely in our rear view mirror, could Chanukah be coming so soon? What will our celebration be without sitting in a circle around all of those blazing *Chanukiyot* (menorahs), singing songs of the holiday? And how can we savor the anticipation of Thanksgiving when it is not yet safe to share hugs and a wonderful meal with those with whom we most want to give thanks?

I miss the oasis of our sanctuary and the physical closeness of our members and guests. Living alone, I have no one else in my "bubble," and even though my work has always required long hours of solitary study, I spend an even higher proportion of time by myself now.

Of course, that is the right thing to do. I was able to vote by placing my absentee ballot in the box at the early voting precinct, so I did not have to participate in the exposure to long lines for long periods. I've got a great new workout and health protocol. And, thankfully, I am able to have everything I need.
