### Rabbi's Message

The history of the Holocaust shows that targeting an entire group has far-reaching consequences. It can lead to an increase in xenophobia, racism, and extremism throughout society, with potentially devastating consequences for individuals, communities and nations – the US Museum of the Holocaust

A hearty *yasher ko'ach* for stepping up to be Board Directors, to Gloria Blankenship and Fred Jacobs, with additional gratitude for his having kept faithfully our list of people for whom we wish a *r'fuah sh'leimah*, a speedy and complete healing; to Helene Bachman, for assuming the position of Secretary; to Roz Wenrich, for taking on the important work of scheduling our newly restored *Oneg Shabbat* and *Kiddush* gatherings after services; and special congratulations to Diane Weinbaum on her nine productive years as a Board Member, spearheading our *Honey from the Heart* fundraiser, representing the Board and sharing congregational news often at our Rabbi's Roundtable discussions, and serving as a blessing both to the Board and to Congregation Beth Sholom.

With such positive news from our members, stepping up to heed President Andrea Kraft's call for service to our congregation, it is with dismay that we must also learn of new manifestations of antisemitism in our nation and abroad.

Germany-based shoe manufacturer Adidas delayed cutting ties with a known, vocal anti-Semite in order to avoid losing millions of dollars in annual profit. This greedy choice, however, permitted Adidas' own dark origins in its founders' support for Hitler to be brought at last to light, in articles such as one published by the Jewish Telegraphic Agency on October 24, 2022. Knowledge is power.

Other acts of violence against Jews – 60% of religious-based attacks in the U.S. – are less easy to answer with our own action. What are we to do about those?

Our members who serve on the Board, as officers, as volunteers at the Leesburg Food Bank, and in many other ways letting their actions express their love for others, are demonstrating the healing power of love. Though we may not be able to prevent evil, or to stop it, we can embody love. In this way, we can be the antidote to hatred.
