## Rabbi's Message

*I can honestly say that I was never affected by the question of the success of an undertaking. If I felt it was the right thing to do, I was for it regardless of the possible outcome. – Golda Meir*

Each of us possesses a calling, a divine intention or *besheret*: a unique, irreplaceable potential attainment, custom designed especially for our own lives. Looking back at her life, Israel's Prime Minister, Golda Meir, saw that her calling had always been to do the right thing.

What is our calling, and how can we recognize it?

The *Mishneh Torah*, the 14-volume compendium of Jewish observance and law undertaken by Maimonides in the medieval era, describes the sounding of the *shofar* at Rosh Hashanah as a wake-up call to repent and improve ourselves:

*It is as if [the shofar's call] is saying: Wake up you sleepy ones from your sleep, and you who slumber, arise. Inspect your deeds, repent, remember your Creator. . . . Look to your souls. Improve your ways and your deeds. . . .*

In elucidating the Torah and oral traditions of Judaism, Maimonides teaches that each person should always look at him or herself, and should see the world, as delicately balanced between good and bad. Even one good act by us can tip the scale of the world to goodness, while a single bad act can tip the world toward evil.

This awareness that our actions may influence the outcome of the entire world infuses an urgency into the custom of giving extensively to charity, and of increasing both our prayers and performance of *mitzvot*, as we prepare ourselves for both our personal judgment, and that of all the world, during the upcoming holidays.

At our *S'lichot* service (September 21<sup>st</sup>, this year also Elul 21), we begin the blowing of the *shofar* that will continue throughout the High Holidays, in accordance with Ashkenazic tradition. Sephardic custom introduces the *s'lichot* prayers – petitions for forgiveness – and the blowing of the *shofar*, on the first day of Elul, a month whose name is a reverse acrostic for *Ani l'dodi v'dodi li*, I am my Beloved's and my Beloved is mine: an intimation of the closeness of G-d and the Jewish people during this season.

Whether we hear the *shofar* daily in Elul, or for the first time on Rosh Hashanah, I pray that each one of us will experience its profound wake-up call not only to repentance, but for an even deeper insight into the very personal calling given to us alone: a whisper of our one-of-a-kind way to shift the balance of this world to goodness.

May we each, like Golda Meir, find within ourselves the courage to answer our own highest call to do what is right, within the circumstances and abilities that define our destiny.

I am endlessly grateful for the call to be your rabbi, and wish every one of you, your family and loved ones, a *shanah tovah u'm'tukah* – a good and sweet New Year – and *k'tivah v'chatimah tovah* – may you be inscribed and sealed for good, in the year to come and beyond – with love and blessings – Rabbi Karen Allen—386-676-5157
